WA's Safe Transition Plan

Based on the latest health advice, WA will open its border allowing for safe travel into Western Australia.

Domestic arrivals

Domestic travellers must be triple dose vaccinated, if eligible, to travel in to WA.



Have a registered G2G pass



No quarantine required



All travellers to provide proof of negative rapid antigen test (RAT) within 12 hours of arrival and report any positive result. This requirement is subject to ongoing review.

International arrivals

All vaccinated international travellers will be allowed into WA. Unvaccinated returning Australians will be allowed into WA, capped at 70 people per week.



Comply with Commonwealth requirements



No quarantine required for vaccinated travellers



Have a registered G2G pass



7-days hotel quarantine for returning unvaccinated Australians



All travellers to provide proof of negative rapid antigen test (RAT) within 12 hours of arrival and report any positive result. This requirement is subject to ongoing review.

Public health and social measures include:



Wear a mask as required



Show your proof of vaccination



Keep checking in



Get vaccinated, including your third dose when eligible



Public health and social measures remain in place based on public health advice
